## The World Stage



Havengore was specially commissioned by the Port of London Authority in 1954 to act both as its flagship and principal survey vessel.

Constructed to the highest standards of British craftsmanship using English oak and teak, she was extensively restored between 1997 and 2008. This distinguished vessel has now resumed her former role and continues to take part in ceremonial occasions and the hosting of visiting dignitaries.




